NFE Programme



- Basic Learning Course 18 Months (illiterate
- PLC-12 months (BLC graduates, gomchens, school drop outs)
- Community Learning Centre (continuing program for NFE graduates)
- Continuing Education (CE) for School drop outs
- Class Timing 3 hrs (convenience of Learners) 5 times weekly

NFE and ICT

- Today there are 9628 NFE learners in 885 learning centers with 875 Instructors in
- Over 160,000 adults have benefited from the NFE programme thus far.
- Far flung villages are being connected with electricity, ICT facility is becoming feasible.

- NFEMIS (Non Formal Education Monitoring Information System) developed, and pilot phase...3
- NFEMIS to be integrated in EMIS (Education Monitoring Information system) - 2015
- Education ICT Master Plan prepared (2013-2018):
- NFE ICT expansion plan included:

- Use of IT materials (Tablet computers)for self learning in remote villages where centers couldn't be opened because of distant and scattered settlements
- Reporting and monitoring system through NFEMIS
